Firstly, I hope that you are all enjoying the recent spell of good weather that we have been enjoying. The month of May has been a strange one, with three bank holidays, including one to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. Here in the office, they have certainly been welcomed as we are incredibly busy and the extra days off have given us all a chance to have a rest!

The biggest news this month, is that Church House has been put on the market for sale. We have known for quite a while that this might happen, but it was still a shock to us all, and quite unsettling, as Church House has been **DAG's home since 1997**. Not only has it been DAG's home, the building has housed a huge number and range of voluntary organisations over the years, such as Relate (Marriage Guidance), Slimming World, The Volunteer Centre, Working Links, Citizen's Advice Bureau, Caring Together, Whitby & District Community Transport, Whitby Underground Young People's Counselling Service and many, many more.

Personally, I have worked in the building since 2002, and it holds many fond memories for me. I've seen many

organisations come and go, but throughout my time here. Church House has always had a reputation for being the place to go if you needed help, and a real hub for community activity, advice and support. The current situation leaves us in limbo as we have no idea how long it will take to sell, or what the new owners intend to do with it. We really hope that it will remain as a community building but in the meantime we have been looking for alternative premises, so that we are ready to relocate if we have to. You might think that finding an office would be fairly easy but for us it's not quite as simple as finding space for a few desks. We need somewhere that is accessible - both in terms of location and the building itself, is affordable, and is near to our mobility equipment hire service down at Whitby Library garage. At Church House we also have the advantage of a meeting / activity room, a room for small meetings and lots of storage. We know that we won't be able to replicate all the advantages of our current location and we have already ruled out a number of properties because of the difficulties people would have in coming to their appointments or dropping in to ask for some advice. Whilst it is a time of uncertainty, we will continue to provide all of our services and support disabled people in the best way that we can.

On a brighter note, I would like to welcome **Nina Didelot** to the DAG Team. She is joining us as a volunteer in the office initially, but will be turning her hand to just about anything (and everything). We do still need other volunteers, especially for the Mobility Equipment Hire service, drivers and Passenger Assistants on our trips and outings, and our Improving Access group. If you have a few hours a week to spare and want to make a difference, please get in touch!

Local all-terrain mobility scooter available from Ravenscar National Trust Visitor Centre

If you love dramatic seascape, cliffs and bird life, the **Tramper** (all terrain mobility scooter) route at **Ravenscar** has it all.

The Tramper scooter gives people with mobility issues access to the countryside and the spectacular views over Robin Hood's Bay in the North York Moors.



A collaboration project between North York Moors National Park, the National Trust and Outdoor Mobility, the Tramper can be hired from **Ravenscar Visitors Centre**, **Tel: 01723 870138**

Sessions are currently only available on Fridays. The hire slots are **at 10.20am or 1pm**, and the sessions last for two hours. Starting at Ravenscar Visitors Centre the 2.7km/ 1.7mile route has a steep downhill on the outward journey and uphill on the return. Users must stay on the designated path, and should be accompanied by another person, as in case of emergency, mobile signals are poor.

What You Can Do With WD-40 by Janet Fife

'If it moves and it shouldn't, use duct tape. If it doesn't move and it should, use WD-40.' WD-40 was invented in 1953, the last Coronation year. The name stands for stands for **Water Displacement - 40th formula**. If at first you don't succeed....

Here are a few of the unexpected ways you can use WD-40:

When nested glasses or pots are stuck, spray them with WD-40, wait a few minutes, then gently pull them apart. Wash thoroughly before using.



To remove crayon or marker from washable surfaces, spray with WD-40 and wipe with a clean cloth.

Thistles and cockroaches will die if sprayed with WD-40.

You can unstick a jammed zipper with WD-40. Use a WD-40 pen, or spray some into a jar lid and apply with an old toothbrush or artist's paintbrush.



Use WD-40 to untangle fishing lines or remove burrs from a pet's fur, or a horse's mane or tail. Spray, and use a pin to undo small knots - but **don't use near an animal's eyes or mouth.**

Caution: always follow the instructions on the tin, and use with care.

Your digital footprint tread with care

Your digital footprint is part of your online history and can potentially be seen by other people, or tracked and held in multiple databases.

Here are some top tips to help you protect yourself, your finances, family and workplace.

- Think twice before sharing information about yourself, family members or friends that would be better kept private.
- Think before you post. Even if your social media privacy settings are set up correctly, there's no guarantee that your posts or photos won't be shared beyond those who you want to see them.
- Be aware that every time you visit a website, your activity is visible to tech companies like website owners, browsers and search engines.
- Read terms and conditions and data privacy policies on websites and apps before providing any personal data or making transactions. If you're not comfortable with the information being requested, don't provide it.
- Check geolocation settings on mobile devices, apps and cameras. If you don't want anybody to know your whereabouts – or where you've been – disable them.
- Never stop enjoying the many excellent benefits of using the internet, but always bear in mind the digital trail you may be leaving,
